We're Evolving the Nonprofit Funding Process

- Need for a sustainable administrative model.
- Reduced strain on nonprofits and county staff.
- Support for long-term program growth and stability.



Two Years..

- Marks the shift from an annual to a biennial application cycle, offering nonprofits a more stable and predictable funding timeline.
- Gives agencies extended time to plan, implement, and evaluate programs without yearly reapplication.
- Supports long-term budgeting and staffing stability for both nonprofits and the county.



More Focus...

- Reduces administrative workload.
- Enables agencies to deepen/strengthen service delivery and improve outcomes.
- Encourages thoughtful planning and evaluation to guide stronger program decisions.



Greater Impact...

- Creates conditions for more meaningful and sustainable results through multi-year program development.
- Strengthens strategic collaboration between the nonprofit partners.
- Strengthens the trusted relationship between county and nonprofit community partners
- Improves community outcomes by aligning time and resources toward long-term goals and outcomes.

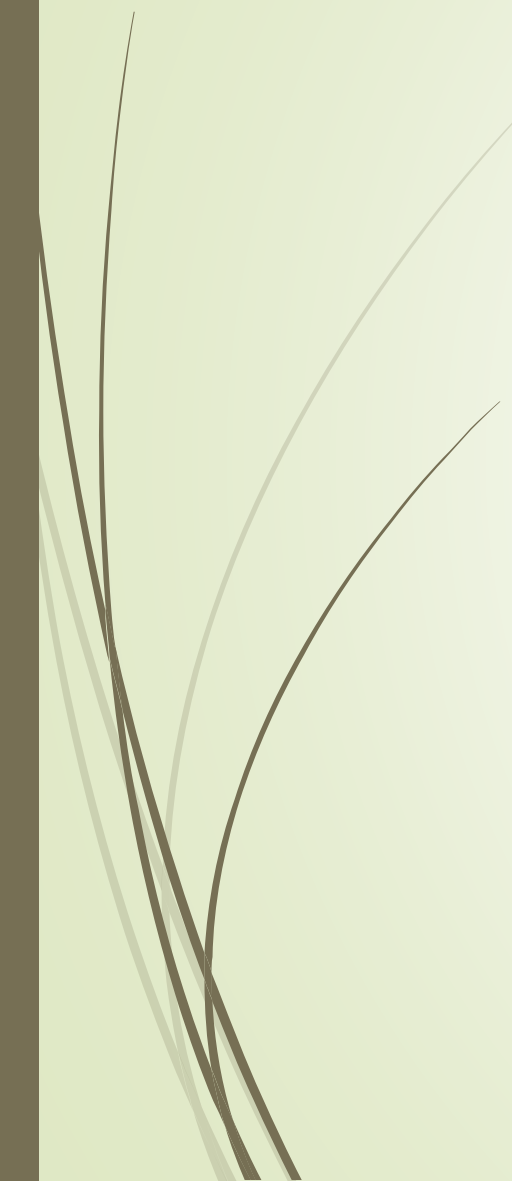


LIVE LOTTERY DRAWING
