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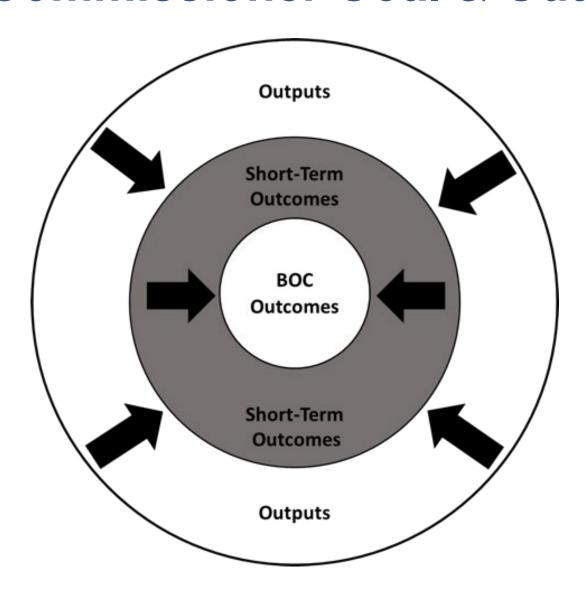

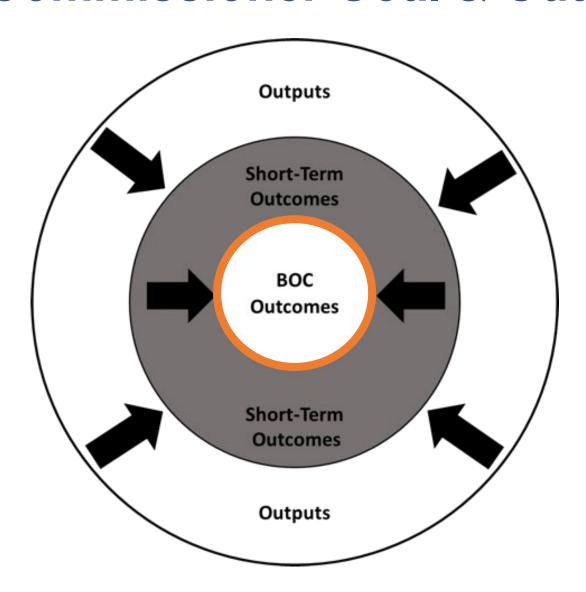

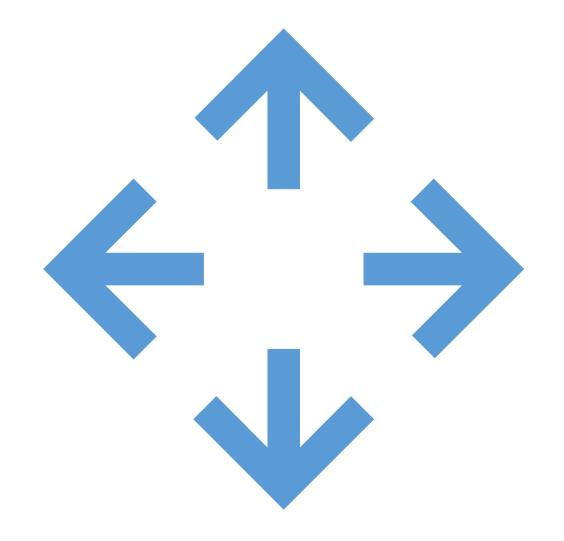

FY25 Board of Commissioner Goal

"To mitigate the impacts of poverty among individuals and households in the county through programs and services that promote stabilization and resiliency."

Stabilization

Process of **reducing risk factors** that can result in crisis or emergency

Resiliency

Process of adapting well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats or significant sources of stress — such as family and relationship problems, serious health problems or workplace and financial stressors (American Psychological Association)

FY25 Outcomes



Improved economic stability for low/moderate income adults



Improved outcomes for children/youth living in poverty



Improved access to comprehensive health care

Economic Stability

Includes programs/services that address:

- Poverty Mitigation
- Employment
- Housing Stability
- Food Security
- Language and Literacy

Children and Youth

Includes programs/services that address:

- High School Graduation
- Enrollment in Higher Education
- Language and Literacy
- Early Child Education and Development

Access to Healthcare

Includes programs/services that address:

- Access to Health Care (Physical and Mental)
- Access to Primary Care
- Health Literacy

Recommendation

- To continue the FY25 Board of Commissioner's Goals and Outcomes
- Approve FY26 Human Services Nonprofit Allocation funding process using the same BOC goals as FY25.
- Consider an application threshold amount:
 - \$80,000.00 per agency

or

Maximum 20% of total allocation per agency



The Board of Commissioners approved a new funding mechanism.

•FY23 Allocation increased by \$10,000 (total: \$260,000)

During the review of the FY24 allocation, the Board amended the funding mechanism.

•Minimum Annual Increase guaranteed at \$10,000 (total: \$270,000 for FY24).

During the review of the FY25 allocation request the Board voted to:

 Board voted to appropriate \$350,000 for Human Services non-profit funding in the FY25 Operating Budget. During budget discussions, the Board voted to:

 Increase funding to \$500,000 for FY25.

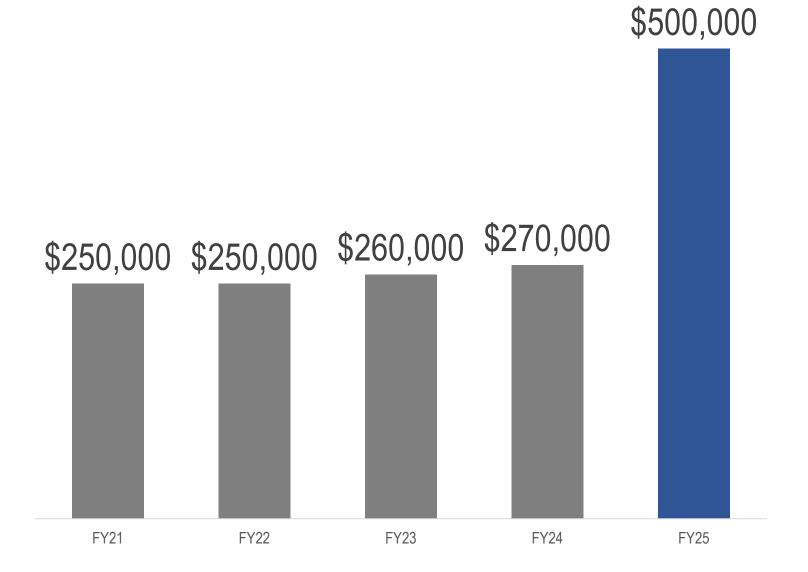

The Board of Commissioners expressed a desire to see these funds increase and to have a model or methodology for annual increases.

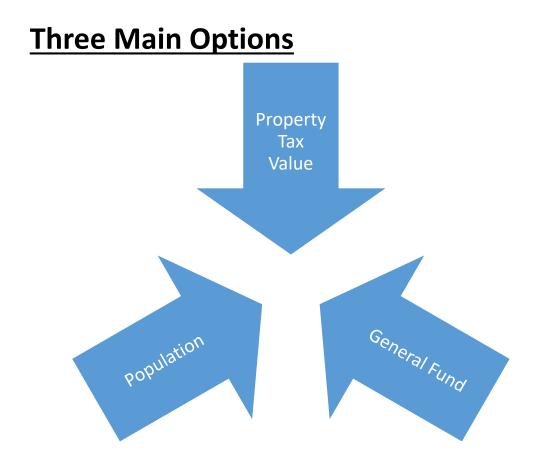
