

# RTP Grant for Trail Funding


 Received grant focused on natural surface trails and paddle access.

 The HRTSC is continuing their work on developing the Haw River Trail.

# Johnson Heirs Bynum River Access

 Chatham County Parks & Rec purchased property adding .7 acres to our public land.





# Farmland Preservation Updates

- 2024 Farmland Protection Plan officially adopted.
- Received three applications to preserve approximately 375 acres of working farmland.
- Partnering with Triangle Land Conservancy to submit a grant for a permanent farmland conservation easement on 221 acres.
- Transaction assistance for a 70-acre farmland conservation easement donation.
- Received a grant award of \$295,443 to match funding for conservation easement acquisition.

# LAND

### Farmland Preservation Outreach

- Farmland Preservation Coordinator Andrew Waters presented to 30 people at the Chatham County Agribusiness Council and is scheduled to speak at the Chatham County Agricultural Impact Summit.
- First Annual Chatham Farms Forever Day Event on December 5th with 75 landowners registered and approximately 55 in attendance.
- Partnering with Land Loss Prevention Group to provide a twopart farmland transition workshop later this year.
- Received a \$7,375 grant to support outreach and publicity for the newly updated Farmland Protection Plan.

# WATERSHED PROTECTION

### Well and Septic Repair and Sampling Pilot

•EH is piloting a program to sample well and septic systems and fund the subsequent repairs.

Early program work is focused on education and staff are seeking grant funding to expand the program.

### Upcoming Backyard Conservation Program

•Volunteer training program to empower individuals to contribute to local conservation efforts and mitigate climate change impacts from their own backyards. Courses will include habitat restoration, water-wise gardening, and organic practices.

# CLIMATE & SUSTAINABILITY

### Waste Reduction & Recycling Enthusiast Program (WREP)

 Educational training program graduated its first class of 9 volunteers. Cohort 2 is expected to begin August 2025.

### Food Waste Collection Pilot Program

•EQ received grant funding to purchase equipment and signage for a pilot program to establish food waste bins at collection centers.

### Sustainable County Merchandise

The GIS department has established Hempsmith Clothing, a local sustainable clothing company, as a vendor for purchasing branded clothing and merchandise.

# Multimodal Transportation Study - Phase 1 RFP Released

•Phase 1 is a public engagement study to identify multimodal transportation perceptions and needs through in-person and virtual outreach. Phase 2 will use the results to focus on long-term planning and implementation.

### **Green House Gas Inventory**

•An updated GHG Inventory for the County is expected to be finalized in April 2025.

### Planning for Extreme Heat

•A coalition from EH, Public Health, EQ, and Cooperative Extension is representing Chatham County at the NC Planning for Extreme Heat Cohort, a new program from NCORR and the State Climate Office.

# CLIMATE & SUSTAINABILITY

### **County Buildings Energy Audit**

•EQ, Facilities, and CPRC collaborated on a federal grant application to conduct an energy audit in county buildings and fund the recommended fixes.

### Planning for Climate Resilience

•Planning staff have begun reviewing climate resiliency resources specific to Chatham, interviewing related departments to summarize existing work, and will be collaborating with Pittsboro on their Climate Action Plan.

# NATURAL RESOURCES

# Natural Heritage Program Inventory

Surveys will be finished in the spring and final report by June 30<sup>th</sup>. So far, 110 parcels have been surveyed totaling approximately 7,576 acres! 53 new natural communities described, and 13 known natural communities updated.

# Wildlife Crossings

 Draft plan updated during public comment period and the final approved plan now available to be accessed via the DCHC MPO website.

# Master Naturalist Program

NC Cooperative Extension in Chatham and Durham counties completed the first Certified Master
 Naturalist class with a graduate class of 45 participants.

# Sustainable Farming Grant

 Cooperative Extension received a three-year research grant for designing eco-friendly farming systems.

# Landfill Management

Environmental Quality and GIS worked together to collect drone imagery of Bidens wildflowers in bloom at

landfill to assess success of wildflower seeding and identify next steps.

# Pollinator Landscaping

- Pollinator Garden Tours
- Workshop and native plant sale
  - Approximately 185 people attended 5 hour workshop from 26 counties and 2 other states.
  - 4 Chatham nurseries and an additional 200 people attended sale afterwards.





# ONGOING COLLABORATION

The Conservation Working Group meets in-person on the fourth Monday of every month. CWG members discuss progress on existing projects, collaborate on ideas for new projects, and connect our work with outside organizations.

### Central Pines Regional Council Grant Assistance Program

•CWG departments are using the program for regional collab., honing project ideas, and application writing for environmental grants.
