Special Events/Programs

- 1st Pollinator Week Celebration event at Northeast District Park: Activities included fishing, potting plants, and seed bombs. Agencies involved were Grand Trees of Chatham, Friends of Lower Haw, Watershed Protection, Chatham Beekeepers, Haw River Assembly. 53 participants.
- 1st Community Pool Day at Northwest District Park: This was a 3-hour swim for free day. 38 participants.
- Enséñame a Pescar (Teach me to Fish) at Northwest District Park: Hosted by NC Wildlife Resources Commissions. Aimed at connecting Hispanic NC families to fishing. Bus transportation was provided from Siler City. The participants learned rigging/knot tying, casting with backyard bass, and cleaning and cooking. 95 participants.
- **Footgolf Tournament at Southwest Park**: Pop-up tournament with 9-hole footgolf course. 20 participants.
- Hosted and offered 169 programs and special events, serving 4,460 community members.







Youth Programs

- 800 plus basketball participants, the largest number of participation in our county Youth Basketball League
- 608 Summer Campers
- 31 Spring Break Campers
- 23 participants for the Kids Culinary classes held at Chatham Grove Community Center

Adult Programs

- Zumba classes held at Community Center: 118 participants
- Open Gym Pickleball & Basketball: 428 participants
- Inaugural Campfire Cooking for adults at Northwest District Park















Collaborations

- Partnered with Chatham County Aging Services to co-coordinate the Senior Games and Silver Arts, with 316 Senior Game participants.
- Began building the county's second Peaceful Pathway at Southwest District Park, in partnership with Chatham County Aging Services and Chatham County Cooperative Extension. This respite area features an accessible pathway and a pollinator area that is dedicated to Chatham County caregivers serving individuals with dementia.
- Goldston Library Collaboration: While kids were participating in a library program, we brought the Chatham Moves Mobile Activity Trailer with yard games and hosted an outdoor scavenger hunt.
- Two Eagle Scout Projects: Caleb Collison built the stage platform at Northwest District Park. Matthew Mitchell built the Mason bee houses at the Southwest District Park Peaceful Pathway.
- In collaboration with Pittsboro-Siler City Convention & Visitors Bureau, we hosted/promoted the Year of the Trail events.








Parks & Facilities

- Installed ball field lights at Northeast District Park.
- Installed shade structures at The Park at Briar Chapel.
- Planted 6 apple trees at Southwest District Park. Once they are big enough, the public will be able to pick fruit.
- Fruit Tree Planting Class: 28 native fruit trees and shrubs planted at Northeast District Park. Includes Pawpaw, American Hazelnut, Persimmon, Red Mulberry, and Elderberry.
- Trail alignment laid out with pollinator area for Northeast District Park.
- Trail alignment laid out for a natural surface trail at The Park at Briar Chapel.
- Staff worked on improvements to 15-501 access path.
- Daisy Girl Scout Troop 707 planted native perennial flowers at Northeast District Park.
- Parker's Ridge Park: New surveys and updated concept plan.
- Awarded EDA Grant for the Haw River Feasibility Study.
