Resolution Authorizing the Disposition of Surplus Property by Privates Sale Pursuant to G.S. 153A-176 and G.S. 160A-266(c)

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statutes 153A-176 and 160A-266(c) authorize a county to dispose of personal property having a value of less than \$30,000 by private sale; and

WHEREAS, Chatham County periodically enters into contracts for the purchase of various items of personal property to replace property that has become surplus, obsolete, or unused; and

WHEREAS, venders sometimes offer to purchase the surplus, obsolete, or unused items that the items they are selling to the county are intended to replace, and to pay for or provide a credit for the surplus, obsolete, or unused items.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The County Manager is hereby authorized to award contracts, and to amend existing contracts, with vendors who supply the county with personal property for the private sale of surplus, obsolete, or unused items to the vendor. Such contracts shall be designed to secure fair market value for the surplus, obsolete, or unused items while disposing of the same efficiently and economically.
- 2. Pursuant to such a contract, the County Manager or designee may deliver and transfer title to the personal property so sold.
- 3. The County Manager or designee shall keep a record of items sold, including a general description of such property, to whom sold, and the sale price or other consideration received.
