Health Impact Priorities

Healthcare Access

1 in 12 Chatham County adults said they did not have a health provider they usually visited when they were sick or needed advice about their health.

Activities for Youth and Young Adults

- 12% of Chatham County youth are considered "Opportunity Youth," or youth ages 16–24 who are not working or in school.
- Substance Use: Treatment and Support
 - Among Chatham County residents who looked for help with drug use, **26.4% found that** help was available to them, 26.4% said it was easy to find, 20.3% said it was high quality, and 20.3% said it was affordable.
 - 67.4% said it was none of the above.

Activities for Youth and Young Adults

All Chatham county youth and young adults have opportunities to engage in their communities through restorative, protective, relevant, and healthy activities.

- Develop a marketing and communications plan to increase the awareness of existing youth and young adult opportunities.
- Increase the availability of spaces for youth by youth through advocacy and participation in planning efforts.
- Increase the representation and participation of youth on advisory boards and commissions in the county.

Identified current marketing and communication strategies of agencies, organizations, and businesses in Chatham who provide activities for youth and young adults.

Shared use agreements for potential community spaces throughout Chatham County.











Healthcare Access

All people in Chatham have access to the healthcare options they need and want.

- Develop an interagency physical and mental health care collaborative in Chatham County
- Develop and increase availability of nontraditional and innovative health care delivery methods, such as mobile and telehealth options.

Established a Systems Navigator network and held inaugural meeting to discuss referral processes and barriers to care.

Established a Healthcare Leadership Collaborative and held inaugural meeting to sha agency and program updates and align priorities.

Substance Use: Treatment and Support

Everyone in Chatham County has the ability to live healthy, full lives regardless of any substance use impacts.

- Establish a referral process between substance use treatment facilities and programs and healthcare providers.
- Develop a county wide communications plan for substance use resources.
- Increase the number of community spaces available to people in Chatham County.
- Advocate for policies that support the building and maintenance of recovery housing in Chatham County.

Behavioral Health/Substance Use provider list created and provided to healthcare providers to improve referral process.

Added a question about marketing and information sharing to Opioid Settlement Funds application.

Exploring using the Community Resource Hub to provide peer support and resources to the community.







Basic Necessities

- Housing
 - Median monthly housing costs rose nearly 10%
 - \$983 to \$1076 (2020-2022)
- Food Insecurity
 - 12.6% of Chatham residents were food insecure,
 - Average meal costs have increased by over \$0.70 since 2019, now \$4.27.

Mental Health

- In 2024, **26.4%** of Chatham adults reported that they had been diagnosed with depression or anxiety
- In 2021, **40.5%** of Chatham County high school students said they had felt sad or hopeless almost every day for two or more weeks in a row
 - Highest for Black female students

Several key mental health indicators have improved among adults in Chatham County from 2021 to 2024.





Healthcare

- Around 1 in 8 Chatham County adults do not have health insurance
 - Hispanic/Latino adults in Chatham County were much more likely to report they did not have health insurance in the past year
- About 26% of Chatham residents without a regular healthcare provider say lack of health insurance is a barrier.

Not being able to get an appointment soon enough is the top barrier to healthcare access in Chatham County.

Could not get an appointment soon enough 13.7%

Provider, service, or medication was not covered by insurance

It was too expensive 5.9%

Did not have health insurance 4.2%

The office was not open at convenient times 3.6%

Did not have transportation to get to provider 1.4%





Not having health insurance is the top barrier to having a regular health provider in Chatham County.

Chatham County residents were more likely to report a recent routine dental visit in 2024 vs. 2021.





Sexual and Reproductive Health

- In Chatham County, the most common STIs are chlamydia and gonorrhea
 - Chatham has fewer reported cases per population than North Carolina or the U.S.

Infant mortality for Black/African American Chatham County residents is higher than for other groups.

This is also true for Hispanic/Latino residents.

Black/African American residents experience a higher percentage of low and very low birth weights in the county and the state.



Substance Use

- **2.4%** of Chatham County adults reported using illicit substances in the past year (2024)
- Chatham County had 37.4 opioid overdose ER visits per 100,000 residents (vs. NC 119 per 100k)
 - **40%** decline from 2023

Substance Use

- 2024 Overdose Death Rate
 - 25% decrease from 2023
 - 18.4 out of 100,000 • residents vs 24.5
 - Mirrors local and national trends

Chatham Overdose Death RATE

Built Environment and Economy

- Infrastructure 0
 - 1 in 5 Chatham County adults want more sidewalks and bike lanes to improve health and quality of life.
- Transportation Barriers 0
 - No sidewalks (1 in 7 adults)
 - Hispanic/Latino adults were more likely to report not being able to afford 0 gas.
 - Women were more likely to report not being able to afford a vehicle. 0

Environmental Health and Equity

- Water Quality 0
 - 57% of residents who prioritized infrastructure and the environment said water quality was their top concern.
 - **21%** of Chatham County wells test above the maximum contaminant level for iron and **33%** test above for manganese (out of 1,544 and 1,539 tested wells)
- Heat
 - Heat-related emergency room visits increased by **30%** in 2024 (vs. 2021) lacksquare
