Project Updates

- DSS Emergency Household Assistance (EHAP) Program
 - 226 households approved for program through June.
 - \$384,370 expended on participants through June 2025.
 - Currently using ARPA-enabled funds
- Hydrant Repair Project
 - Contractor started work in late May 2025
 - Three hydrants replaced in June
 - 60 hydrants are planned for replacement

Project Updates (Cont.)

Schools HVAC Project

- BOE is set to approve contracts in September
- Estimating a one-year timeline for completion

County Fiber Extension to Siler City

- Project substantially complete
- Funding primarily ARPA enabled and some Health department grant funds to connect to the clinic in Siler

• Detention Center Shell-Space Buildout

- ARPA Enabled
- Successful competitive design-build RFQ (May)
- Design phase will begin in FY26

ARPA Enabled Projects (continued)

- Through FY26, remaining ARPA Enabled funds may be reduced from \$1.2M to \$850,000 from continued project spending
 - EHAP, Webb Squared Contract, CPRC Street Outreach Coordinator Contract
- Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Resources have been awarded two grants requiring matching funds
 - Deep River State Trail feasibility study (\$75,000 match)
 - Pegg Tract Improvements for the Haw River State Trail (\$152,294 match)
