## **PUBLIC INPUT SESSION**

No one signed up to speak in person, but someone submitted comments online. Clerk Lindsay Ray would convey the comments to the commissioners.

## ARPA PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Courtney Cooper-Lewter gave a brief overview of the purpose of gathering public input on ARPA funding and possible uses. The next four dates for community meetings:

March 8th at Chatham Central

March 10th at Moncure Fire Department

March 15th at Silk Hope Ruritan Club

March 17th at Chatham Grove Community Center

Ms. Cooper-Lewter said there will be free food at 5 PM and all meetings are scheduled to begin at 6 PM. Chatham County staff volunteers will be onsite to provide free childcare for residents and there are free N-95 masks available.

Ms. Ray reminded speakers they have three minutes to speak.

Gretchen Smith submitted comments with supplemental information and spoke in-person. Ms. Smith said that visitation to the Haw River has increased since the beginning of the pandemic. Increased visitation has increased traffic and parking in the Bynum area. She made suggestions of how to create safe public access to Haw River and help address the needs in some of the Chatham master plans. More specific information and estimated costs have been included in an addendum Ms. Smith sent to Ms. Ray for the commissioners to review.

Melanie York submitted a PowerPoint presentation (sent to Board of Commissioners' emails through Clerk Lindsay Ray). Ms. York advocated for homeless Chatham neighbors. She said the United States HUD Secretary, Marsha Fudge, spoke out about the great urgency of homelessness. Homelessness was a crisis in the nation. We ignore what we do not like to see so we ignore poverty and homelessness. Two unsheltered individuals died in Chapel Hill. COVID-19 has caused shelters to be difficult to keep safe. Last fall, Secretary Fudge launched House America and called for ARPA funding to be used for the unhoused. Chatham had many needs gaps and adequate sheltering must be prioritized. ARPA funds could aid in ending homelessness.

Jeffrey York was a member of CHAIN. In January he volunteered with homeless outreach. More outreach efforts are needed for the homeless in Chatham County. There are thirty or more individuals that have short-term sheltering at Siler City hotels with the aid of two non-profits. Chatham County has little mechanisms to address the needs of the homeless. Mr. York was asking for action. The hotel voucher program was helpful but not sustainable. Mr. York provided solutions that other communities have implemented.

Susie Crate submitted comments and spoke in-person. Ms. Crate suggested allocation of ARPA funding to the lower haw. The installation of a trail bridge over Pokeberry Creek would create an accessible riverside trail. This would stop erosion of the riparian buffer corridor caused by weather and visiting hikers to the trail system. Bynum residents have become heavily impacted at the mill site by the increase in hikers.

James Garbutt submitted comments and spoke in-person. Mr. Garbutt said land preservation, particularly along the Haw River could be a use of the ARPA funds and create something transformational. To protect additional land and trails of the lower haw up to the Alamance County line could be achieved through easements or land purchases. Expanded access to nature for residents would impact public health. Protection of the waterway through the cleansing lands along the banks of the Haw would improve residents' drinking water. Many cannot afford a gym membership but can find access to the trail systems. These options meet the goals of the American Rescue Plan. He urged the board to be bold.

Robert James Bruekner submitted comments and spoke in-person. Mr. Bruekner loves the Haw River and has canoed it for nearly forty years. He suggested river access and trail work along the Haw River. Chicken bridge access of Chatham County has a restrictive easement with NCDOT and is in need of a property for boaters to use. The US 15-501 Bynum dam has an access that has never been improved and is a mud pit and causes difficulty for boaters trying to get their boats out of the water. The Roberson Creek access at Jordan Lake has a floating dock that has become damaged over the years. He thinks it is time to install a ramp. The eighty-four-acre tract of land near the Bynum Dam has social trails that need improvement. This is a beautiful place that needs sustainable trails.

Joy Hewett submitted comments and spoke in-person. Ms. Hewett said land preservation would support public health and improve water quality. The preservation of natural areas would provide generations' sanctuary and joy along the Haw River. Time spent in nature improves mental and physical health. The County land provides equity for low income residents and protected areas are a low-cost benefit.

Ms. Ray said all submitted comments that have been received will be consolidated and sent out as one email to the commissioners tomorrow.

Mr. LaMontagne said currently the G.R.E.A.T. grant application period was open The County is in talks with three internet service providers and are planning to partner with all three. The County can also look into the CAB program.
