

#### Overview

\$200,000 allocated to help support low-income Chatham County families by offering up to \$500 to qualifying applicants.

- Must of residing in their home for 5 years or more
- Family total income must be below 60% of current AMI
- Not receiving any other tax exclusion or exception
- Applicant must be current on all property taxes

(Began accepting applications in February 2025)

Results (as of June 9, 2025)

84 applications received

76 approved (90%)

\$34,159 paid directly to applicant families

## Results (Cont.)

• 50% of the denied applicants were already receiving another tax incentive

 Applications have slowed considerably over the past month showing signs of program saturation.

 Program requirement changes appear necessary to allow for these funds to be dispersed to the residents most in need.  The Area Median Income (AMI) be adjusted from 60% to 80%

(by definition HUD classifies 80% and under as 'low-income')

5	\$68,640	\$99,900

### Recommendations (Cont.)

 Allow residents to apply for the lowincome tax relief program even if they are already receiving another tax exclusion or exception.
