## Sustainable Facilities Policy

- Sets Goal of LEED Silver Version 4 with a Minimum of LEED Certified for County owned and County funded projects including:
  - All new building construction
  - Major renovations of buildings (5,000 sf or more)
  - Renovations impacting major building systems affecting energy consumption

## Sustainable Facilities Policy (cont.)

- Will also look at existing facilities to become LEED Existing Building: Operations & Maintenance (EBOM) Certified where feasible.
- Preference to design practices and building systems that have ROI of < 7 years.</li>
- Flexibility to not follow all requirements of the policy if "uniquely cost prohibitive" (greater than 5% increase in cost)

## **Current Projects**

- Three county projects have previously registered for LEED Certification:
  - CCCC Health Sciences Building
  - New Northeast Elementary School
  - New High School
- All three are registered with the USGBC under the previous version of LEED.

## **Additional Cost**

- We expect there to be an increase in the design and/or construction costs for current and future projects as a result of the LEED Certification.
- Additional costs for current projects were not included in the CIP estimates.
- Additional costs for current projects were not included in the Debt Model.
