

80% Flushed Off Watershed with Rainfall









Accomplishments


- 5,800 volunteers
- 345 cleanup events
- 14,000 bags of trash, about 140 tons, 40 large dumpsters
- 4,300 tires
- 15 miles of shoreline cleaned (repeatedly)
- 900 members, meetup.com/helpcleanjordanlake
- \$800,000 in donated services
- \$27,000 in grants and major donations

Cumulative Cleanup Events




Cumulative Volunteers, Bags and Tires





AASP Volunteers, Bags, Tires & Events by Year






