## A Resolution by the Chatham County Board of Commissioners Recognizing June 19<sup>th</sup> as Freedom Day or 'Juneteenth'

**Whereas** the January 3<sup>rd</sup> 1863 proclamation of President Abraham Lincoln declared emancipated all people enslaved in territories controlled by the rebellion against the United States; and

**Whereas** people held as slaves in southern Texas were not told about the Emancipation Proclamation until Major General George Granger landed U.S. Army troops at Galveston on June 19<sup>th</sup>, 1865; and

Whereas the African-Americans freed from bondage and their descendants celebrated Freedom Day or Emancipation Day thereafter, and the Civil Rights movement revived and spread the observance; and

**Whereas** the public library and Chatham Organizing for Racial Equity have organized entertainment and educational speakers for June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 10:45 to 6pm at the Agricultural and Conference Center, in celebration of Juneteenth; and

Whereas the people of Chatham County are committed to social justice and equal opportunity for all citizens;

**Therefore**, be it resolved, that the county hereafter recognizes June 19<sup>th</sup> as Freedom Day, 'Juneteenth,' a date for reflection on the historical and ongoing struggle for equality and civil rights.
