Administrative Policy

- Approved by the County Manager in 2015
- Went into effect March 1st, 2016
- Expanded from 50-foot rule to cover <u>all</u> county grounds, including parks
- Includes e-cigarettes

Chatham County Town of Siler City Tobacco-Free Ordinance

Chatham County Comprehensive Plan

- Chatham County Parks and Recreation Master Plan
- Siler City Master Parks and Recreation Plan
- Pittsboro Master Parks and Recreation Plan

...all include tobacco policy recommendations.

Rationale

- Three-year anniversary
- Well-received among employees and visitors
- Very few compliance issues

- Model for other counties and local municipalities
- Sets a positive example for youth
 - Protects visitors and employees from secondhand smoke
 - Ordinance formalizes policy

Electronic Cigarette Products and Youth Use

- Over 1,000 hospitalized and 18 deaths (10/3/2019)
- 2011-2017: Increase 894% among NC high school students
- Chatham County High School students: 46% ever used
- Exposes users and non-users to known cancer-causing chemicals, heavy metals, volatile organic chemicals, nicotine
- Nicotine is highly addictive, affects brain development
- May lead to adult cigarette use and addiction



Tobacco-Free Ordinance




- May adopt an ordinance that applies to unincorporated areas
- If city agrees, ordinance may apply within incorporated areas




