# Case Study: Arvada, CO Community Building Grants

#### Know Your Neighbor Grant

 Supports block parties and community clean-ups by providing \$50-\$100 gift cards to local grocery and hardware stores

#### Neighborhood Printing Assistance Grant


 Provides \$25 printing assistance through the city's print shop for printing flyers and posters to publicize community events

#### • \$250 Neighborhood Small Activity Grant

- Funds larger neighborhood events/development projects such as festivals, sports tournaments, or t-shirts
- Ex: Front Yard Happy Hour Starter Kit

# Community Building Grants: Impact

- Accessibility for residents to put on events at multiple scales
  - Role of in-kind assistance (ex: block party trailer with tables, chairs, etc)
- Increased sense of community
  - Support for local businesses; ability to quantify and map impact
- Feedback loop through post-event evaluation form
  - Increased interaction between residents and government



# Community Building Grants: Relevance to Chatham

- City of Arvada examples help us think through creative ways to allocate resources that help residents put on events
- Role of the county: educate residents and other local municipalities about the process and potentially maintain a collection of reusable event resources
- Instead of neighborhoods, look to social institutions like volunteer fire departments, churches, and rec leagues as community anchors that can host events and bring people together
- If considering allocating money through gift cards, think through grocery store accessibility

## Case Study: Brevard, NC Retiree Resource Network

#### **Basic Principles of Brevard/Transylvania Retiree Resource Network:**

- Network of retired former business professionals
- Free consulting to young entrepreneurs and local businesses
- Network managed by a Resource Coordinator

#### **Funding:**

- Little funding required
- Community Development Block Grant for Resource Coordinator compensation

#### **Impact**

- Between 2004 and 2007, more than 25 local businesses benefited from the consultation services
- Received an Outstanding County Program Award by North Carolina Association of County Commissioners in 2007

# Retiree Resource Network: Lessons for Chatham

#### Potential Role of Chatham County:

Work as the convener of the resource network

#### **Community Development Potential:**

- Stimulate economic development
- Provide resources for young entrepreneurs
- Sharing of better business practices

#### Community Engagement Potential:

- Connect residents of Chatham through meaningful consultations in any context

   Chatham's accompany and life.
- Encourage and involve older residents in Chatham's economy and life

- Small Business Center at the Central Carolina Community College
- Chatham Chamber of Commerce
- Chatham Economic Development Corporation (EDC)

# Creative Placemaking: The Big Picture

#### Citizens' Institute on Rural Design

 Introducing creative placemaking, arts, culture, and design strategies as drivers of economic development in rural America

#### **Arts Education Partnership**

 By the year 2020 every student in America, will have equitable access to high quality arts learning opportunities, both during and outside of the school day.

#### **NEA Research Labs**

 A national program that permits transdisciplinary research teams, grounded in the social and behavioral sciences, to engage with the NEA's 5-year research agenda.

# Creative Placemaking: The Big Picture



#### **Public Art vs. Temporary Public Art**

- Public art instills meaning—a greater sense of identity and understandings of where we live, work, and visit—creating memorable experiences for all
- Typically developed and managed by a municipal agency such as a local arts agency or private entity
- Art Interruptions are artworks that inhabit city sidewalks and parks and offer passers-by a brief interruption in their day, eliciting a moment of surprise, beauty, contemplation or humor.

# Case Study: Shoulder to Shoulder (Los Angeles, CA)

#### **Purpose of program**

A community based arts project that brings together a group of diverse youth

#### When it happened

- Pilot program: Summer 2001
- Program was revamped this summer 2019

#### **Funding**

 The program was funded by the Mayor's Office of Youth, the Human Relations Council, the Los Angeles City Attorney's Community Development Fund, and art nonprofits in the city

# Shoulder to Shoulder: Impact of Program

- The initial program had a positive result on the youth. They were able to meet people from across the city that had different backgrounds and bond.
- They were able to learn expressive techniques in the arts and receive an arts based education

#### **Currently...**

 The City Attorney's Office decided to pick up the program again this year because they saw a need for unity amongst youth in the city.

# Shoulder to Shoulder: Examples of the Arts Project





#### Shoulder to Shoulder: Relevance to Chatham

- Although Chatham's size and demographics differ greatly from Los Angeles, the need and value of youth engaging to understand and express their different backgrounds and bond from different parts of the county can be applied
- This can be a way to leverage arts and community organizations in Chatham to use art as a platform to inspire civic engagement
- Community arts promote the following:
  - Interaction in a public space
  - Increased civic participation
  - Engage youth in the community
  - Promote power and preservation of a space

# Case Study: Small Scale Participatory Budgeting (Merced County, CA)

#### **Participatory Budgeting**

A way for community members to become engaged in the budgetary process through proposal submissions and voting

#### Why Merced County? What is the Importance of the scale in this example?

#### The Process

- Steering Committee
- Proposal Submissions
- Committee fleshes out proposals
- Community votes
- Commissioners vote

# Participatory Budgeting: Impact of Program

- Able to fund three community projects:
  - Community garden
  - County food bank outreach initiative
  - Concerts in the park program

 Merced County is in the midst of their second participatory budgeting process



# Participatory Budgeting: Relevance to Chatham

Merced County is an example of participatory budgeting done on a *small*, *localized level* 

#### Participatory budgeting:

- Uplifts voices of marginalized communities
- Allows for increased government transparency
- Increases civic participation and education

# Case Study Takeaways

- Rural Community Building: Creatively offsets the costs of putting on a community event, building community and supporting local businesses
- Retiree Resource Network: Achieves community engagement and community building through connecting knowledgeable retirees with developing local businesses for the sharing of better business practices
- Creative Place-Making in Small Towns: Joining the arts, local government, and youth communities in Chatham through civic participation can contribute to community development
- Participatory Budgeting: Creates a way for persons within diverse communities to have a stake in local government

# Guiding Principles for Chatham

- Chatham County needs to decide what aspects of their community they want to develop
  - What populations demonstrate the most need?
- A team should be put into place to lead this initiative
  - Is there a team of diverse officials that can come together to lead this? How will they be selected?
- Use the case studies as examples to brainstorm to see what could eventually be implemented and applied in Chatham (with consideration of demographics, population, and resources and capacity)
